

## **Discussion Questions**

- 1. What did you know about the nursing home/long term care system prior to this book? What surprised you?
- 2. The book shines a light on the sub-par treatment those in nursing homes may receive. Who is at fault here? The staff? The doctors? The government?
- 3. How does Susan's experience working for the ministry of health help her as she navigates the nursing home care system? How does it hinder?
- 4. Susan and her brother have a difficult relationship. What do you think about the resentment Susan feels toward him surrounding their mother's care?
- 5. The book discusses the gender roles associated with caring for a loved one (i.e., women are expected to, while men are praised). What do you think?
- 6. How does the relationship between Susan and her mother change over the course of the book?
- 7. Do you think this book would be a good resource for those with a loved one going into nursing home or long-term care?
- 8. Do you think the graphic format of this book added or took away from the work? Have you read a graphic novel before? Would you read another?
