


## **Discussion Questions**

- 7. The Son of the House is a book primarily about women. What is the significance of the title?
- 8. What was your favourite part of the book? What would you have changed?
- 9. What did you think of the end of the book? How does the story actually end?
- 10. What comes next? What do you wish the author had explored more?




