


We Have Always Been Here Samra Habib

Discussion Questions

- 1. The author details their childhood in Pakistan and the differences between men and women. How do you think this shaped the author's life following their move to Canada?
- 2. Discuss the incident that the author says caused them to "[lose] their right to be a child." What do you think of how the author's parents handled this?
- 3. The author discovers that they have been betrothed to her cousin, Nasir, at age 10 and then gets married at 16. Discuss their relationship and its eventual end.
- 4. The author discusses two other significant relationships with men: Peter, who they move in with and later marry as a way to get out of their parent's control, and Alex, a queer man who they share a polyamorous relationship with. How are these relationships different? In what ways are they similar?
- 5. Discuss the author's relationship with their parents. How does it change over the course of their memoir?
- 6. How does the author's trip to Japan change things in their life?
- 7. "I could hardly believe I was coming back to my faith in the same neighbourhood where I attended my first drag show. Minutes away from a cluster of lesbian bars and leather clubs, I was meeting myself again in my thirties." Discuss this quote and the author's decision to begin attending Unity Mosque.
- 8. Do you have a chosen family? How do connections with chosen family differ from those with biological family members?




