BACKGROUND

Programs and Events

Creative Age

Since July 2024, we've delivered 52 Creative Age programs at 11 Library branches as part of our partnership with the London Arts Council with funding from the New Horizons grant. Total attendance for these programs so far is 365 people. Creative Age programs will continue until the end of January, with programs including watercolour painting, drama, song writing, dance, creating writing, and mixed media art.

Fanshawe College Pop-Up Library Events

Library staff visited the three London campuses of Fanshawe College, where they created and updated almost 110 Library cards for students, answered questions about services, digital resources, and programs. Staff spoke to a total of 448 students.

Newcomer Day

Staff had a great experience participating in Newcomer Day on October 5 at the South London Resource Centre. The organizers separated the community resources from the hiring opportunities this year, which allowed the Library to have more meaningful conversations with attendees.

Ronald McDonald House Charities of Southwestern Ontario Drop-In Visit and Children's Activities

This was the first recurring visits to the RMHC, where staff provided a variety of activities for families, including Indi Cars, a sensory bin, Snap Circuits, button maker, a book donation of withdrawn items, as well as info on Library programs. Staff spent time with a few families, who appreciated the activities, and who spoke to us about some of the challenges they've been facing. This was an impactful visit, and staff look forward to their next visit.

Celebrating 15 years of the Library Settlement Partnership

The 15th anniversary of the Library Settlement Partnership (LSP) was celebrated on October 19, 2024 at the Beacock Branch. This milestone event not only recognized the ongoing success of the partnership between the Library, LUSO Community Services, Northwest London Resource Centre and South London Neighbourhood Resource Center, but also honoured the dedicated settlement workers who have played a crucial role in supporting newcomers to Canada. The LSP provides free settlement services, helping newcomers access vital resources and information as they adapt to life in London and in Canada.
